Emphasis will be placed on the importance of **LOCATION** and **SURFACE** terminology regarding the differential diagnosis of raised soft tissue lesions of the oral mucosa.

- Critically evaluate relevant oral and maxillofacial pathologic and dermatologic scientific literature regarding soft tissue lesions.
