This seminar will provide an update on occupational infection risks for dental health-care professionals, as well as a practical discussion of current infection prevention regulations and recommendations for dentistry. The most recent CDC recommendations concerning blood borne pathogens and infection control will be presented, along with updates on OSHA regulations as they pertain to dental settings. Hand hygiene, vaccinations, and other preventive measures (i.e. personal protective equipment, instrument reprocessing, disinfection, and dental water asepsis) are frameworks for this presentation. Blood borne pathogen challenges and prevention strategies will be used to reinforce the application of standard precautions during patient treatment. This seminar will also include discussion on the public health implications of vaccine-preventable disease outbreaks.

The most recent evidence-based information is also discussed to address certain issues where perceptions and misuse of infection control procedures and products are in conflict with scientific and clinical knowledge.

Seminar Objectives:

- Understand the most recent updates for State and CDC infection control recommendations including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations.
- Understand the rationale for effective, hand hygiene procedures as fundamental components of an infection control program.
- Describe recent epidemiological trends and challenges blood borne infections present to healthcare workers
- Comprehend the most current vaccination recommendations for dental personnel
- Understand the challenges outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases present to healthcare workers and the public
- Describe recent technology advances and protocols for instrument processing and sterilization
- Comprehend efficient and effective approaches to monitor sterilization
- Describe the use of disposables and disinfectants used in environmental surface asepsis.
- Describe causative factors and features of waterborne infections in health care settings.
- Comprehend practical strategies which may minimize forms of DUWL contamination.
